Crowea exaltata

COMMON NAME

Small crowea, Wax flower

ORIGIN

Open forests and woodlands of Victoria and New South Wales

DESIGN USE

It is a versatile plant and suits many situations in the garden including rockeries, hedging

or as a tub specimen.

HABIT

Crowea exalata is a beautiful small spreading shrub with aromatic foliage and profuse pink flowers.

FORM

The general effect is dome-shaped, sometimes arching gracefully but more often twiggy and irregular.

FLOWERS

Flowers are 5-petalled and usually range from pale to mid pink in colour although white forms are known.

FLOWERING PERIOD

It appears in late summer through to mid winter.

CLIMATIC TOLERANCES

It prefers a well-drained position in sun or semi shade. The species is tolerant of at least moderate frosts and is usually pest free but can sometimes be effected by scale and sooty mould.

HORTICULTURE

It prefers a well-drained position in sun or semi shade. The species is tolerant of at least moderate frosts and is usually pest free but can sometimes be effected by scale and sooty mould.
