

SPECIES Banksia marginata
COMMON NAME Silver Banksia

ORIGIN New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania and South Australia

DESIGN USE Coastal areas and streetscapes



### HEIGHT

Small shrub: less than 1m Medium shrub: 4m

Trees: 8m

### **SPREAD**

Varies from 0.5 to 5m

## **HABIT**

It is typically a medium shrub but also occurs as a scrambling, prostrate plant and as a small to medium-sized tree.

#### **FORM**

There's a dwarf variety, rounded bushy form and becomes straggly as a tree. It has finely-toothed long foliage with a dark green upper surface and a silvery reverse.

### **FLOWERS**

Cylindrical spikes and pale yellow in colour.

# **FLOWERING PERIOD**

Early Spring through Autumn

## **FRUIT**

The seeds are enclosed in follicles attached to a woody cone and are generally retained within the cone until burnt.

### CLIMATIC TOLERANCES

All varieties are adaptable and frost hardy. Moisture may vary from damp through well drained to dry. The plant is tolerant of salt and lime, preferring acid to neutral soil.

## **HORTICULTURE**

The species is not demanding in regard to soil types but waterlogged ground should be avoided. The plant favours a position in full sun or dappled shade. This quick growing plant is also a potential windbreak and fire retarder and benefits from pruning.
