

SPECIES COMMON NAME ORIGIN DESIGN USE

Dianella caeruela Blue flax-lily, Cerulean flaxlily England, Victoria, New South Wales, Tasmania, and Queensland Great roadside plant



HEIGHT

40cm-200cm

SPREAD

65cm

HABIT

It is a herb with leaves 30-50cm long and about 20mm wide. They are hard, stiff and glossy.

FORM

It is a sprawling plant where the leaves branch from long stems, rather than tufting from the ground. Plant tufted and solitary or gregarious, or mat-forming.

FLOWERS

The perianth is pale to a dark blue, or green-blue, the anthers at the centre are yellowy brown.

FLOWERING PERIOD

Spring and Summer

FRUIT

Berry is 7–12 mm long.
