HABIT

Grevillea 'Honey Gem' is a large, free-flowering hybrids characterised by a tall habit. It is low branching and has an open habit making it ideal as either a feature shrub or part of a mixed planting.

FORM

Has ferny leaves and large racemes of colourful flowers. Honey Gem is a medium sized erect to spreading shrub.

FLOWERS

The large, golden-yellow racemes of flowers are around 150 mm in length and attract honey-eating birds.

FLOWERING PERIOD

Can be seen at most times of the year, with a flush in late winter/spring.

VARIATIONS

- "Misty Pink" (pink and cream)
- "Sandra Gordon" (yellow)
- "Moonlight" (cream)
- "Sylvia" (bright pink)

CLIMATIC TOLERANCES

Plants are tolerant of at least moderate frost.

HORTICULTURE

A sunny, well drained position is preferable in the garden. It only requires supplementary watering during establishment and during extended dry periods. It also responds well to pruning and suitable as a commercial landscape plant due to its low maintenance requirements.
