HABIT

Fast-growing, vigorous shrub with long, wide leaves.



FORM

Large, open, dense shrub with glossy deep green leaves, silvery beneath.

FLOWERS

The flowers are orange spider type which resembles the colour of orange marmalade. These are borne in short terminal racemes and styles in red-dish-black colour with a thick covering of long brown hairs along full length of style, large tufts of brown and grey hairs at the base.



FLOWERING PERIOD

Most of the year

CLIMATIC TOLERANCES

This is basically a plant for subtropical and tropical regions. It is said to have a medium tolerance to drought. Frost tolerance is not good, and it does better in warmer climates.

HORTICULTURE

Best in moist well drained soil in full sun.
