

SPECIES COMMON NAME ORIGIN DESIGN USE

Jasminum nitidum Star Jasmine, Angelwing Jasmine, Confederate Sasmine, New Guinea's Admiralty Islands Hedges, foundation plant, shrubby ground cover, or to cover a fence or trellis

HEIGHT

Can grow 6.1m long but in the garden is often trimmed as a bushy shrub that gets little more than 0.6-1.2m.

SPREAD

2m

HABIT

An evergreen or semi-evergreen vine or shrub that is fast-growing and becomes woody with age.

FORM

Semi-twining plant easily held to a shrub form.

FLOWERS

Sweetly fragrant, snow-white, pinwheel shaped flowers to almost 2 in across. The flowers start out as purplish buds and retain some pinkish-purple on the calyx. They bloom at night.

FLOWERING PERIOD

Late spring and throughout the summer

CLIMATIC TOLERANCES

USDA Zones 10 - 11. Angelwing jasmine is frost-tender. It can be grown with winter protection in zone 9.

HORTICULTURE

Full sun to almost full sun, doesn't do well in shade. It needs regular watering, especially during the growing season. It has moderate salt tolerance and is adaptable to most any soil.
