



SPECIES	Pandorea jasminoides
COMMON NAME	Bower vine, or pandorea, pink jasmine
ORIGIN	Australia, Queensland, New South Wales and Victoria
DESIGN USE	Excellent vine to grow in large containers, for fence or trellis

6 m

HABIT

evergreen vine

FORM

It is a vigorous twining plant with pinnate leaves having between five and seven lance-shaped leaflets up to 50mm long.

FLOWERS

The large flowers are tubular, ending in five spreading lobes. The flowers are usually pale pink with a deep pink throat and are about 35 mm long.

FLOWERING PERIOD

Spring and late summer

CLIMATIC TOLERANCES

It is very hardy in tropical to temperate regions although it may be damaged by frost during very cold winters. Will grow in full sun to partial shade.

HORTICULTURE

Propagation can be carried out easily from either seed or cuttings. Will set roots anywhere vine touches the ground. It is adaptable to any reasonably drained soils and It prefers a reliable water supply but, once established, will tolerate extended dry periods.
