<b>DESIGN USE</b>	Container plant, plant massing, feature plant



### HEIGHT

0.5-3m



### SPREAD

1-5m

### HABIT

Woody, shrubs or ramblers, usually thorny. Hybrid tea rose cv grown for cut flowers are typically sparse caney shrubs.

### FLOWERS

Terminal flowers, singly or in massed heads, through most of the year, usually perfumed.

### FLOWERING PERIOD

Through most of the year

### VARIATIONS

'Iceberg' (a neat, bushy shrub popular and reliable worldwide, new forms have pink or burgundy flowers)

'Floribunda' (have small flowers massed in large panicles)

Rosa x damascene (Damask Roses, are derived from species and heritage cv from the middle east)



### CLIMATIC TOLERANCES

Roses generally require sunny, open airy in moist well-drained soils, preferably with a heavy texture to retain nutrients, and are fairly drought tolerant once established.

### HORTICULTURE

Most roses are prone to fungal diseases to varying degrees, especially in the humid tropics. Reduce maintenance by selecting hardy cv situated to local conditions.
