

SPECIES COMMON NAME ORIGIN DESIGN USE

Rosa cv

Rose China Container plant, plant massing, feature plant



HEIGHT

0.5-3m

SPREAD

1-5m

HABIT

Woody, shrubs or ramblers, usually thorny. Hybrid tea rose cv grown for cut flowers are typically sparse caney shrubs.

FLOWERS

Terminal flowers, singly or in massed heads, through most of the year, usually perfumed.

FLOWERING PERIOD

Through most of the year

VARIATIONS

'Iceberg' (a neat, bushy shrub popular and reliable worldwide, new forms have pink or burgundy flowers) 'Floribunda' (have small flowers massed in large panicles) Rosa x damascene (Damask Roses, are derived from species and heritage cv from the middle east)

CLIMATIC TOLERANCES

Roses generally require sunny, open airy in moist well-drained soils, preferably with a heavy texture to retain nutrients, and are fairly drought tolerant once established.

HORTICULTURE

Most roses are prone to fungal diseases to varying degrees, especially in the humid tropics. Reduce maintenance by selecting hardy cv situated to local conditions.
