HABIT

It is a twining evergreen vine, often used as a groundcover. The stems will twine and clamber over supports and can also cling to walls and hard surfaces with great ease and abandon.



FORM

It grows as a neat tangle of slender wiry stems that exude white latex when cut.

FLOWERS

1 in (2.5 cm) white, long lasting and unusual pinwheel flowers which delicately breathe enchanting fragrances into the spring air.



FLOWERING PERIOD

Late Spring to early Summer.

CLIMATIC TOLERANCES

It can also tolerate drought once established.

HORTICULTURE

Trachelospermum jasminoides need full sun to partial shade with warm, humid conditions during the growing season. During the growing season, the plants are kept moist and are fertilized on a weekly basis. During the winter months, water is reduced to a minimal amount to keep the foliage from wilting or dying back. Repotting should be done in the spring or mid-summer after flowering.
