COMMON NAME	Brisbane Golden Wattle, Fringed Wattle
ORIGIN	Eastern Australia
DESIGN USE	Hedge or screen plant



HEIGHT

7m

SPREAD

6m

HABIT

Small deciduous tree.

FORM

Erect or spreading, rounded shrub or tree with dense foliage. Branchlets slender, with indumentum of short, spreading to appressed hairs often confined to the fine ribs, sometimes glabrous.

FLOWERS

3–5 mm diameter, bright yellow, sometimes paler yellow.

FLOWERING PERIOD

Spring

FRUIT

Pods straight to slightly curved, flat, straight-sided to slightly and often irregularly more deeply constricted between seeds.

BARK / TRUNK

This large shrub to small tree has an upright trunk with slightly pendant branches forming a bushy rounded crown. These plants also produce valuable timber or the bark is used for dyes.

CLIMATIC TOLERANCES

The Fringed Wattle is very frost tolerant and drought resistant.

HORTICULTURE

Propagation from seed. Hardy in most situations. Adequate water is required.
