COMMON NAME	Broad-leaved Lilly Pilly, Blush Satinash
ORIGIN	NSW, QLD, NT
DESIGN USE	Hedge, windbreak, shade tree



HEIGHT
8-15m

SPREAD
10m

HABIT
Evergreen tall rainforest tree with a spreading branches when young.

FORM
Medium-sized to tall trees with flaky, often fissured bark; bark on twigs smooth, becoming slightly flaky with age.

FLOWERS
The flowers are creamish or white and occur in clusters at the ends of the branches.

FLOWERING PERIOD
Late spring to early summer

FRUIT
White succulent fruits, edible, often in large clusters.

BARK / TRUNK
The trunk is flanged or buttressed in larger trees, with red brown bark. The bark is fairly smooth on younger trees. Fissured and flaky on larger trees.

CLIMATIC TOLERANCES
The species is resistant to at least moderate wind (second line salt wind), moderate frosts and tolerates extended dry periods once established, although it will have a better appearance if adequate water is available.

HORTICULTURE
Highly resistant to psyllids. Retain only one main trunk for a tree or tip prune regularly from a young age for a shrub.
